## CHRISTMAS AT OWSLEY COUNTY ELEMENTARY

Mission of Hope provides a special Christmas to kids at 27 different schools located in Southeast KY and Northeast TN. Students at Owsley County Elementary received a big surprise when Mission of Hope visited their school just before Christmas break.

After bringing in box after box, volunteers transformed the school gym into a toy store. Students entered this

"wonderland" by grades and selected the toys they wanted to call their very own. They also received hygiene packs and other necessities.

"They smile the rest of the day because they feel like someone cares about them from outside of their family . . . they feel like they have a chance," said teacher James Cornett. Teachers like Cornett, who

have watched Christmas come early for these students for many years, say this day brings a lot more than a bag full of toys for each child.

"With the resources we have there is only so much we can do. Christmas is about giving, and if you can give a child a good holiday and a smile . . . that is pretty amazing," explained Cornett.

"This group really fills a big void in this county," said Cornett.

## A BLESSED YEAR FOR MOH MINISTRY

We were richly blessed in 2015 with the privilege of serving those who need our help the most throughout rural Appalachian communities. By working with elementary schools and mountain ministry centers located in these areas, we are making a difference by assisting those in the depth of poverty. Our hearts truly break for those who are struggling in areas which offer little opportunity for new jobs or prosperity. Many coal mining jobs that provided economic stability for many in years past have been totally eliminated.

We minister in a variety of ways at the HOPE. Envision a tree with two roots and seven branches. The two roots we serve the rural poor through are our Elementary Schools and Mountain Ministry Centers. The seven branches are: Resource Distribution, Back-to-School Program, Christmas Program, Healthcare, Construction, Scholarship and

Evangelism. It is our approach to help those in dire need and yet insure accountability for our supporters. Last year we put 91 cents of every dollar back into our ministry. Christmas will always be the gift of the Christ Child. In our year-round ministry, we incur expenses from time to time that are not always in our budget. We are now attempting to get a better delivery box truck. We will be selecting a new class of Scholars this spring. It is our desire to locate new ministries which might need a hand up in as they serve others.

## MIRACLE AT A RAMP BUILD PROJECT

I just had to share this powerful story that took place at our last MOH Handicap Ramp Build Project in the Black Mountain, KY Community. We go to Black Mountain Elementary School there and our MOH Team for this School is Christ Covenant Presbyterian Church. The Team Captain is Ginger Forbes and she discovered this heart-breaking need while at their HOPE Academy Mission Trip last summer. We made it our last Ramp project for 2015. It was a two day project, and we had a great group of MOH Volunteer Heroes led by our Construction Ministry Leader Barry Ownby and me to build it. Just so you will know, I am the least qualified to do construction. I think they take me along just to buy lunch and dinner. I also make

the runs back and forth to local building supply store to get the materials needed to complete our projects.

On the morning of our second and final day there, a lady next door came running out of her house and into the yard of the house where we were building the ramp. She was screaming for help for her husband who was not breathing and in dire need of assistance. Three of our MOH Ramp Team Members ran into their house and performed emergency CPR. They saved the man's life.

I returned from the building supply store to see the ambulance loading the patient to rush him to the local hospital. He not only survived but was also released from the hospital a few days later and is doing well. Ginger and some other MOH friends actually got to see

this family and the family that we completed the Handicap Ramp for a few days right before Christmas.

This may be one of the greatest examples I know of in our ministry's history where God had us somewhere for a completely different reason—one that only He knew. That beautiful October fall day we were His Vessel for fulfilling Hope and extending Life. Dear God, thank you for the privilege of being your Servants.

I have located a beautiful color pictured Bible that will work for both children and adults. They normally cost \$9.95 each and I have been able to purchase them for \$2.95 each. I need 11,000 of them and they have now been shipped here. We have already been blessed with two \$10,000 Donations to go towards this purchase. If you are interested in making a donation towards this purchase we would be immensely grateful. We must, as a Christian ministry, continue to share the greatest gift to all who will receive it.
