BACK-TO-SCHOOL PROGRAM

Volunteers worked diligently to pack hygiene kits, school supplies and backpacks for the students in grades K-8 in the schools served by the Mission of Hope. Volunteer teams then go to deliver and distribute these supplies to the 12,000 students at the 28 schools served by the Mission of Hope. Many parents of students in the rural Appalachian areas of TN and KY cannot afford to purchase school supplies needed by their children.

MOH RECEIVES DONATION OF INSTRUMENTS

It started with a letter from a principal of one the schools we serve. It was a request for musical instruments for her students that wanted to play music. Her problem was there were no musical instruments available to the school and no funds with which to purchase desired instruments. We began to spread the word of this need, and MOH friends responded by donating used instruments in good condition. When we delivered them to the school which had appealed to us, the principal and volunteer music instructor were overcome with our generosity. Their students would now have the opportunity to learn how to play these instruments.

Last fall, we were blessed to have Gwen Wilkinson as a new MOH volunteer friend. After hearing me share the story of the school that needed instruments. Gwen immediately went to work to help us find instruments. She called on her previous employer in the Nashville, TN area, KHS America--one of the largest distributors of musical instruments in the World. They became interested in Mission of Hope and in the schools and areas we serve. They were sensitive to the need for musical instruments in the schools that did not have them and no available funds with which to purchase them. And, yes, you are right! KHS America donated a truckload of brand new musical instruments. Gwen and I drove down to their distribution center to pick up the instruments. We were welcomed by KHS America President, Tabor Stamper, and many of the employees. We loaded our truck with all types of instruments-drums, guitars, flutes, clarinets, trumpets, xylophones, etc.

We will never be able to say a big enough thank you to KHS America and to Gwen Wilkinson for deeming the Mission of Hope worthy of their compassionate generosity. Now we can share HOPE through music as we encourage children and adults to learn and develop their musical skills.



MISSION OF HOPE SCHOLARSHIP NEWS

The Mission of Hope Scholarship Program was a special time of celebration as we honored the college graduation of five more of our scholarship recipients. We have watched them grow and mature in amazing ways. Many have faced incredible and sometimes overwhelming odds just to stay in school. Many have endured hardships, personal challenges and family tragedies that could have ended their pursuit of getting a diploma.

Our scholars have persevered-they didn't guit! Their determination and efforts were rewarded as they walked across stages with heads held high to receive that coveted diploma which was once only a dream for them. This is HOPE FULFILLED!

In May and June of this past school year, helps those students that dare to dream. It MOH volunteers visited each of the 13 high schools we serve to award the winning graduate a \$2500 scholarship from the Mission of Hope. These scholars and their parents were honored with a dinner on July 21 at Cumberland Inn in Williamsburg, KY. They were assigned a MOH mentor to be their friend and helper as they begin their college days. Each scholar was also presented with a computer with carry case, printer and software.
